YAFS4 THE 2013 YAFS STUDY

Background


- The 2013 Young Adult Fertility Survey (YAFS4) is the 4th in a series of nationally-representative surveys on Filipino youth 15-24 years old
- Jointly implemented by the
 - Demographic Research & Development Foundation (DRDF)
 - University of the Philippines Population Institute (UPPI)
- Funded by The Australian Government, UNFPA, Department of Health, Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD)



Predecessor surveys

1982 YAFS

(5,240 female respondents)





1994 YAFS

(10,879 male and female respondents)

2002 YAFS

(19,728 male and female respondents)





General objective of YAFS4

To provide updated information on a broad framework of adolescent sexuality and reproductive health issues, their antecedents, and manifestations that will be useful in the design of interventions to safeguard the health and welfare of Filipino youth.



Survey design

Sampling design: Multistage stratified

random sampling

Sampling domain: Region

Sample size per region: About 1,000



Respondents in YAFS 4

- 19,178 respondents
- 11,425 15-19 y/o and 7,753 20-24 y/o
- Among the 15-19 year olds:
 - **5773** are male
 - 5652 are female



Survey instruments

- 10 survey instruments
 - Household Form
 - 8 Individual Questionnaires for the youth respondents
 - 4 Main Questionnaires
 (Single Female, Married Female, Single Male, Married Male)
 - 4 Muslim Questionnaires
 (Single Female, Married Female, Single Male, Married Male)
 - Community Form
- All questionnaires were translated to 6 major languages



Field implementation


- Fieldwork was conducted in January to May 2013


Young population in the Philippines







Size and growth rate of the male population ages 15-19, 1960 - 2010




The number of teen males 15-19 is expected to continue increasing until it reaches its historic peak in 2035 after which its number will start to decline.



Most of the male teenagers are never married but among those ever married, more are in a live-in arrangement than in a formal union


Marital Status of males ages 15-19






Most of the male adolescents 15-19 are in school or are working




The English proficiency of the male teenagers is declining.




More of the lower educated male teens desire 4 or more children

Teenage males are becoming more liberal on premarital conception, marriage and divorce




High level of sexual exposure of teen males

Sexual behavior of males age 15-19






Increasing proportion of teen males are engaging in early sex





Sexual initiation starts at age 16






Very low level of protection during first PMS, mostly to avoid pregnancy





Teen males are also engaging in other sexual behaviors





Married teen males are sexually active


Frequency of sexual intercourse in the past 7 days among married males, 15-19

Extra-marital pregnancy

 4.3% of married teens have ever gotten someone pregnant other than their spouse/partner

- This is more common in the more urbanized regions
 - CALABARZON: 12.5%
 - Western Visayas (Region VI): 11.1%
 - NCR: 9.1%




Unmarried teen males fertility experience


 3.9% of single male teens have gotten someone pregnant

- This is most common in the following regions
 - Western Visayas (Region VI): 10%
 - CARAGA: 9.7%
 - MIMAROPA (Region IVB): 8%



Premarital sex and pregnancy of sexual partners among their unmarried male friends





- Increasing number of teen males ages 15-19
 numbering 4.9 M in 2010. The number is
 expected to increase further until it will reach its
 peak in 2035.
- Most of them are not married, currently studying or working.
- About a fifth (18.2%) had no schooling or with elementary education.
- Declining English proficiency
- Most of them (85%) were raised by both parents.



- Most teen males think it is ideal for both men and women to start having children when they are in their early 20s. They desire to have 3 children.
 - About 16 percent want four or more children particularly those with lower education, working as unpaid family workers and living in ARMM
- Their desire to have 3 children on the average implies that the country will not see the current fertility decline to replacement anytime soon, assuming that they will achieve their desired fertility.



- Changing values of the teenage males as shown by the increasing acceptability of premarital sex, divorce and premarital pregnancy.
- Increasing number of teen age males are engaging in early sex.
 - A fifth of them have PMS experience with very low level of protection, mostly to prevent pregnancy.
 - Considerable level of sexual risk taking behavior such as casual sex, FUBU and sex with the same sex among others.
 - Half of married male teen agers have children, 4.3% of them admitted they have ever gotten someone pregnant other than their spouse/partner
 - 3.9% of single male teens have gotten someone pregnant
- This contributes to the increasing teen fertility in the Philippines in the recent years as indicated by the NDHS findings.



Of the estimated 5,072,169 males age 15-19 in the Philippines in 2013:

- 131,876 are in a live-in arrangement vs. 30,433 in legal union
- 1,009,362 engaged in premarital sex
- 162,309 had sex before age 15
- 1,273,114 had sex before age 18
- 233,320 has engaged in casual sex
- 172,454 has FUBU experience
- 172,454 had sex with the same sex
- 65,938 have been paid for sex
- 55,794 have paid for sex
- 197,815 have gotten someone pregnant
