




INITIAL STRUCTURE

RESOLUTION NO. 045-2007

A RESOLUTION ENACTING MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2007-045, AN ORDINANCE STRENGTHENING THE PUKON, ADOPTING THE PUKON SYSTEM AND PRESCRIBING ITS RULES, REGULATIONS AND FUNCTIONS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT OF SAN FRANCISCO, CEBU.

WHEREAS, as provided for in paragraph (16) SECTION 391 of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, the Sangguniang Pangkayugan provide for the organization of community groups, barangay fests, or community service units as may be necessary;

WHEREAS, the Department of Education through its Non-Formal Education Coordinator had organized Pukons in the different barangays in the Municipality as to support systems and beneficiaries of non-formal education;

WHEREAS, the Non-Formal Education Coordinator in the District of San Francisco, Cebu had seek assistance from the LGU in the implementation of the Pukon System, and since the activity is run by the local officials as active partners in the pursuit of local autonomy, delivery of basic services and maintenance of peace and order in the locality, the municipal government through Municipal Mayor Alfredo A. Amabiliano, Jr. had conferred Pukon as People's Organizations (POs) and one of the community service units in the barangays, and the same have been endorsed by all the 15 barangay chairs in hereon as one of its support service units.

WHEREAS, it had been for so many years that the municipal government, barangay councils, and the Pukons go hand in hand in so many activities for socio-cultural-economic developments and for the general welfare of the constituents;

WHEREAS, this body believes that in order to achieve camaraderie and harmony between the Sangguniang Councils, Pukons and its constituents, and uniformly in the implementation of activities undertaken by Pukons, conducting, same to be considered and properly governed by the Municipal Government of San Francisco, Cebu;

WHEREAS, the following other provisions of RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, shall be another basis in the creation of Pukons and the determination of its rules, regulations and functions, to wit:

- a) SEC. 34. *Role of People's and Nongovernmental Organizations* – Local government units shall promote the establishment and operation of people's and nongovernmental organizations to become active partners in the pursuit of local autonomy.
- b) SEC. 35. *Cooperate with people's and Nongovernmental Organizations* – Local government units may enter into joint ventures and such other cooperative arrangements with people's and nongovernmental organizations to engage in the delivery of certain basic services, capacity-building and livelihood projects, and to develop local enterprises designed to improve productivity and income, diversify agriculture, open rural industrialization, promote ecological balance, and enhance the economic and social well-being of the people.


Ten-point Checklist - Essentials for Making Cities Resilient

- ✓ **Essential 1:** Put in place organization and coordination to understand and reduce disaster risk, based on participation of citizen groups and civil society. Build local alliances. Ensure that all departments understand their role to disaster risk reduction and preparedness.
- ✓ **Essential 2:** Assign a budget for disaster risk reduction and provide incentives for homeowners, low-income families, communities, businesses and public sector to invest in reducing the risks they face.
- ✓ **Essential 3:** Maintain up-to-date data on hazards and vulnerabilities, prepare risk assessments and use these as the basis for urban development plans and decisions. Ensure that this information and the plans for your city's resilience are readily available to the public and fully discussed with them.
- ✓ **Essential 4:** Invest in and maintain critical infrastructure that reduces risk, such as flood drainage, adjusted where needed to cope with climate change.
- ✓ **Essential 5:** Assess the safety of all schools and health facilities and upgrade these as necessary.

Ten-point Checklist - Essentials for Making Cities Resilient

- ✓ **Essential 6:** Apply and enforce realistic, risk compliant building regulations and land use planning principles. Identify safe land for low-income citizens and develop upgrading of informal settlements, wherever feasible.
- ✓ **Essential 7:** Ensure education programs and training on disaster risk reduction are in place in schools and local communities.
- ✓ **Essential 8:** Protect ecosystems and natural buffers to mitigate floods, storm surges and other hazards to which your city may be vulnerable. Adapt to climate change by building on good risk reduction practices.
- ✓ **Essential 9:** Install early warning systems and emergency management capacities in your city and hold regular public preparedness drills.
- ✓ **Essential 10:** After any disaster, ensure that the needs of the survivors are placed at the centre of reconstruction with support for them and their community organizations to design and help implement responses, including rebuilding homes and livelihoods.
