
Number of predatory, standalone journals, 2013-2015
















Tips on Dealing with Predatory journals

1. Predatory publishers are not cooperative with attempts to "retract." OMICS, for example, have filed a million dollar lawsuit against Jeffrey Beall; and keeps a running list of articles they've published reporting research funded by the US National Institutes of Health.


